# **Gluing Zines Together**

### **SUPPLIES:**

Cover page
2-3 pieces of paper
Glue



# STEP 1:

Fold pieces of paper in half, hamburgerstyle. These will become your inserts.

### **STEP 2:**

With the folded edge to your left and opening on the right, put glue on one of your inserts.

### **STEP 3:**

With the folded edge to your left and opening on the right, place another insert on top of the glue.









# **STEP 4:**

Repeat steps 2–3 for however many pieces of paper you want in your zine.

# **STEP 5:**

Place all the glued-together inserts to dry.

#### **STEP 6:**

Open your cover page so that the blank inside is face up.

#### **STEP 7:**

Put glue all over the page.









# **STEP 8:**

With the folded edge of your inserts to the left and opening to the right, glue your inserts to the right half of your opened cover page.

#### **STEP 9:**

Next, press your cover page closed over the inserts, and press. Then set aside to dry.



# **Sewing Zines Together**

#### **SUPPLIES:**

Cover page
2-3 pieces of paper
Needle
Thread/string
Scissors



### **STEP 1:**

Fold pieces of paper in half, hamburgerstyle. These will become your inserts.





#### **STEP 2:**

Once all of your inserts are folded, align the middle of your papers and stack them on top of each other.



### **STEP 3:**

Wrap the cover around the outside.

#### **STEP 4:**

Take your thread and pull out to twice the length of your arm, or about 2 feet.





#### STEP 5:

Once you've pulled it to the proper length, double it up so that it is twice that length, about 4 feet.

*(It's better to have a thread that is too long than too short.)* 



# **STEP 6:**

Using your scissors, cut the thread.

# **STEP** 7:

Thread the needle by putting one end of your thread through the hole at the end of the needle.

# **STEP 8:**

Pull your thread so that the needle is in the middle of your thread. Match up the ends of your thread and tie a knot.









### **STEP 9:**

Make a hole in the middle of your zine as shown, and poke the needle through so the knot is now on the outside of your zine.

#### **STEP 10:**

Flip your zine over and make another hole halfway between your thread and the top of your zine pages.

You've made one stitch!







# **STEP 11:**

Pull the needle and thread back through to the front side of your zine.

#### **STEP 12:**

Thread your needle back through the middle hole of your zine.





### **STEP 13:**

Pull the needle back to the middle of your zine. You should now have one stitch on the inside of your zine, and one on the outside.



# **STEP 14:**

Pull the needle and thread back through to the front side.

#### **STEP 15:**

Put your needle back through the middle hole again, making the last stitch for your zine.







# **STEP 16:**

On the inside of your zine, tie a few knots to end your sewing.

#### **STEP 17:**

You can tie a knot by threading your needle under one of your stitches.

# **STEP 18:**

Make a loop.







# **STEP 19:**

Thread the needle through the loop and pull tight.

#### **STEP 20:**

Repeat. (You don't have to do this step, but it helps make a tighter knot.)





# **STEP 21:**

Cut the extra thread, and you're done!
